## The Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP)



- 92% of small businesses report that they are unable to find applicants to fill their open positions. At the same time, there are 1 million older adults looking for work.
- SCSEP is the only federally funded training program empowering older workers with the skills needed to be successful in the modern workplace.
- SCSEP provides upskilling, reskilling, and job training to nearly 40K older adults annually living in both rural communities and urban centers.
- SCSEP is one of the few and, in some cases, the only reskilling program preparing older workers living in underserved communities: 57% of SCSEP job seekers are older people of color and 66% are older women.
- Without SCSEP, communities in every state across the nation will lose a vital training program leaving older workers unable to compete in the modern workforce and businesses with an ever-worsening labor crisis.
